Inspire academic excellence and nurture service leadership in our students by supporting a range of performance awards such as bond-free Scholarships, Book Prizes, Gold Medals and Outstanding Student Awards. At SIT, an endowed fund to support full Sscholarships can be established with an endowed gift of \$335,000 or a partial term Scholarship with a gift of \$30,000.

The range of Excellence Awards can be supported by annual term gifts ranging from \$1,500 to \$5,000 over a duration of four consecutive years.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

To help deserving students in financial need, support bond-free Bursaries, Study Grants and Emergency Funds. At SIT, a bond-free Bursary to support disadvantaged students in perpetuity can be established with an endowed gift of \$112,000 while a term Bursary can be made possible with a gift of \$20,000.

WHAT IS A TERM GIFT?

A term gift is entirely spent, either immediately or over a period of time, to support the donor-specified gift purpose.

WHAT IS AN ENDOWED GIFT?

An endowed gift is not spent but is invested to generate an annual income to support the donor-specified gift purpose. It will support the gift purpose in perpetuity, since the principal sum is left intact.*

**In accordance with the Ministry of Education's (MOE) current guidelines, endowed gifts to SIT are eligible for the enhanced 1.5:1 Government Matching Grant. Of this Enhanced Government Matching, 33% (or about 0.5 of your gift amount) can be designated towards the endowed gift purpose.*

SIT'S PUNGGOL CAMPUS OF THE FUTURE

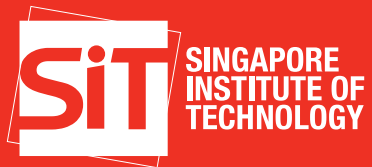
SIT will be the first autonomous university to have its campus right in the heart of the upcoming Punggol Digital District (PDD).
